The requested fund will be used to tutor students for the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) and English language improvement for the refugees and immigrants in middle and high school. In my three years mentoring in TeensAlive ministry, I identified that many students are unable to receive high school diplomas due to their poor performance in the MCAS. Many of them told me that they lack a proper foundation in the English due to the past schooling in refugee camps in Thailand and Malaysia. The target group is mostly refugees and first and second-generation immigrants who attend Lowell Public Schools in Massachusetts, however, others who are willing to attend will also be accepted. We have about 50 prospective students who will need MCAS support and 99 percent of those students come from low-income families that resettled in Lowell in the past 5 years. Most of the children were born in refugee camps in Thailand. We have already done 10 sessions in last Fall. And there will be a total of 20 sessions; 10 in the Spring (on going) and 10 in Fall 2016. We have 15 senior and junior high school students from Chelmsford and 10 certified adults teachers. At this juncture we require a huge sum of money for the other expenses involved in this project.

It is my privilege to be one of the minister under ABCUSA and take this opportunity to apply our second year for the Matthew 25 Grant for the immigrant teens who are from low income families in the city of Lowell, Massachusetts. Since 2015 September TeensAlive ministry has organized Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment System (MCAS) tutoring to refugee students and first generation immigrants middle and high schoolers starting. We have already done 10 sessions in the Fall 2015. There will be 10 sessions in Spring and 10 sessions in Fall 2015. Many of our teens are not able to get high school diploma because they failed in MCAS exam. Right now, we are blessed by excellent tutors: 18 senior and junior High School students from Chelmsford and 10 certified adult teachers.

Lowell is an ethnically diverse city with17.2 percent of the population living below poverty level out of which 22.1 percent are children. It has the second largest high school in Massachusetts and it has about 4000 racially and ethnically diverse student community. The city household income is below state average. A little less than a half of the city population are immigrants from different parts of the world. Besides, there are also many refugee immigrants who have arrived in recent years. All these factors contribute to the city children's vulnerability to many social, spiritual, psychological and economic issues.

Surely your generous grant will be able to help the immigrant teens improve their English language and successfully get high school diploma. Therefore, it is my earnest request to consider our request.

TeensAlive program is a ministry of Calvary Baptist Church, Lowell, MA. It is a Christian program for preteens and teens to help them engage in different activities that are based on the Bible and Christian moral values. It is designed to help teens to engage in a variety of activities with the opportunity to explore their talents and gifts in order to live abundantly utilizing the abilities God has given. This ministry offers holistic empowerment programs to provide balance between body, mind and spirit. Besides a few Caucasians, most of our teens are first and second generation immigrants from seven different countries (Cambodia, China, Myanmar, Congo, East Ivory Coast, Vietnam and India) and most of them are living in Lowell except one from New Hampshire, two from Methuen, one from Dracut, one from Chelmsford and three from Newton.

It has been another successful year for TeensAlive ministry with God's amazing grace through out the year. The ministry has become more known to other churches as our teens have involved in many activities under TABCOM. This year there were many accomplishments and we have done more than we planned.
