Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day fund, church benevolent fund, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church or Region that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

#### #3: The N.O.W. = Neighbors On Wheels Ministry Statement

The NOW Team was formed following "Missional Church Learning Experience" training with Mrs. Glennis LeBarre with the American Baptist Home Mission Society in 2011. After much prayer and soul-searching, the team felt that God was leading us to go "outside" the walls of the church in order to form loving, trusting relationships with families living in the vicinity of the church—but seldom, if ever, attending. Our mission statement, "To share God's love in a practical way across the street in neighboring communities" has been our guide. Our first visit into the neighborhood of "Green Valley" took place in January of 2012 when we sponsored "winter games," served hot chocolate, and shared gloves and hats with the children. Since that time, we have held a community event in this neighborhood on a monthly basis. Though the pace has been slow, we have gradually seen the community come to trust us and the doors and hearts have been opened wider in the ensuing four years.

Crab Orchard Missionary Baptist Church has a rich history of supporting Baptist missions throughout the state, nation, and world. However, never had a mission target been "across the street."

The NOW Team simply goes out into the neighborhood with the goal of reaching those who are not comfortable or interested in attending a church. We go into the community to lend a helping hand and to share the love of Jesus Christ in a positive way. We have hosted many events such as Movie Night (large screen set up on the lawn of a neighborhood partner), Dumpster Day (we provide commercial dumpsters for disposal of household furniture, etc.), satellite Vacation Bible School and Bible School events, Back-to-School Bash (we provide school supplies & jeans), Hot Dog Cook-out, Hamburger Fry, and Pancake Breakfast, Community Carnival (with large blow-up toys for children, games [great fun with water balloon toss, egg toss, 3-legged race, etc. with adults participating] prizes, food, etc.).

The economic forecast for southern West Virginia is bleak. With fossil fuel falling out of favor, the once booming, thriving coal mines are now closed with little hope of re-opening. Families have been left unemployed with little training or opportunity for work in other industries. The impact is wide-spread—beyond the confines of the coal industry. The trickle-down effect has now been felt by every support industry and business in the region. This neighborhood has been affected more than most.

As we grew to know the families in the neighborhood, we recognized the need for a "backpack program" to provide food for children on the week-ends. We are currently supplying food for two local elementary schools—which is a very costly but much-needed project. Alleviation of hunger enables these children to reach their God-given potential. Our past sponsor is no longer able to provide assistance; therefore, the Matthew 25 grant would fill this need. If approved for the Matthew 25 grant, we will be able to continue this program for the children in our neighborhoods who may be the "least of these."
