We hope to help erase this obstacle by providing funds at the point when funds are needed.

First Baptist Church of Lawrence, KS Project Description: Transportation Assistance

Lack of reliable transportation is a very common obstacle for people in poverty and others who are trying to improve their situation. People need bicycles or gas for their cars—or functioning vehicles in general—to get to job interviews, but conversely, they need jobs to buy the bicycles or gas and to afford repairs. Kids need transportation to school. People of all ages need transportation to the doctor or for other medical needs. Although some of the organizations we plan to assist do have funding of their own for transportation needs of the people they serve, the funding is limited and inadequate. We are hoping to use the Matthew 25 Grant to supplement this to close the gap between the need and the available funds.

Organizations We Plan To Assist

Family Promise of Lawrence is the organization with which we presently have the strongest ties, and we're most familiar with their needs. Their mission is "to transform the lives of homeless children and their families by providing safe shelter, food, counseling, and training in partnership with local communities of faith through hospitality and daily living support in a compassionate setting. The program is designed to address the needs of families and equip them to move into permanent housing as quickly as possible." Demographically, all families served by Family Promise are currently or have recently been in a situation of homelessness. Historically, roughly 50% of their guests are under the age of 5. Helping their guests find employment is a high priority: 93% of guests, year-to-date, are employed within 30 days of entering the program. Reliable transportation, including bus passes, car maintenance, and car repairs (the need for which are all carefully screened by Family Promise staff) are a huge part of equipping families to be successful in the Family Promise program and to acquire and sustain their own permanent housing.

Once we became aware of this need through Family Promise, we began to question what other Lawrence area organizations might be struggling to provide for the transportation needs of the people they serve. Other organizations we've reached out to and will make the grant funds available to include:

Willow Domestic Violence Center: They work to restore "the health and safety of people who have experienced domestic violence or human trafficking by providing safety, education, and advocacy...." They provide bus passes for the people they serve.

Ballard Community Services: "A non-profit institution that provides affordable, high-quality early education and essential life assistance for individuals and families in need." They say that "Transportation is one of the largest needs that we come across that we are unable to help with." They are also an umbrella organization that includes **Sun Cedar**, a non-profit manufacturing organization that offers meaningful paid employment for at-risk people—the homeless, felons, recovering addicts, etc.— empowering them with a sense of purpose and restoring their dignity

The Shelter, Inc.: They give out bus passes and gas vouchers to help at-risk children. For example, The Shelter, Inc. assists if a child needs to go for medical help, or if a student needs a ride to school.

The Sheriff's Reentry Program: Helps people who have been incarcerated successfully re-enter the community as accountable, contributing, self-sufficient and law-abiding citizens.

We sincerely appreciate your consideration of this proposal. We believe it will greatly improve the chances of those struggling to get out of poverty and to reenter the community as contributing members of society.
