First Baptist Church of Filer, Idaho, requests a \$5,000 <u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT</u>. These funds will specifically assist individuals battling poverty and its effects. The below highlighted points outline our course toward meeting the educational needs of those less fortunate in our community.

- A \$5,000.00 <u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT</u> enables us to provide financial assistance toward families who struggle economically and seek help with their greatest asset; their children.
- Our staff is professionally trained, educated, and licensed to provide such services.
- The project targets local families needing daycare/preschool service but are not financially positioned to obtain that need. We plan on attracting those families via word of mouth, personal connections, church ministry contacts, local public school relations, local resource officials, and direct solicitation of those who occupy local public housing.
 - This grant will enable financial coverage in the following area;
 - Meals; breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks.
 - Education; preschool and kindergarten programing.
 - Enrichment; crafts, reading, and structured play time.
 - Child Care; while parents are at work or pursuing needful education.
- We expect success by realizing 10 new individuals entering the program on a weekly basis. We expect the children to
 improve their social skills, academic skills, and spiritual awareness. We expect the parents to experience professional
 stability, education growth, financial latitudes and spiritual awareness.
- Success is evaluated and measured via communication, documentation, and family stability. Our application process
 will comprehensively determine the families immediate circumstances, projected goals, financial boundaries, and
 long term objectives. We will pursue obtaining scheduled progress reports and coordinate these efforts via school
 counselors, social workers, and other related counselors.
 - Application process for those who are less fortunate considers the following areas;
 - Applicants must complete common forms and paperwork.
 - Applicants request financial assistance and outline their need and action steps.
 - Applicants required to verify status and objective plan for changing circumstances. We coordinate
 these steps with local public and private agencies; South Central Community Action Partnership (a
 local federal agency whom we have worked with before) The Mustard Seed (a private agency
 providing help to the needy).
 - Monthly update process coordinated with the granted recipient.
- The programs start date is September 2, 2013 and concludes May 30, 2014

We currently provide the above outlined services on a limited basis. Our current funding minimizes this opportunity. We believe that a \$5000 <u>MATTHEW 25 GRANT</u> will enable us to take a more aggressive stance in our community. It will enable parents the opportunity to pursue work opportunities, educational needs, and the peace of mind that there children are being effectively cared, and trained in a qualified atmosphere.
