3. How do you plan to use the requested funds? How will funds specifically assist individuals battling poverty and its effects?

Charlotte children are going hungry reported by Kim Caudell, Principal of Charlotte Public Upper Elementary School. The ability of families to be gainfully employed is greatly decreased when nearly a quarter of the 18-24 year adults living in the city of Charlotte do not have a high school degree. 21% of the households in the city of Charlotte earn less than \$25,000 a year. U.S. Census American Fact Finder estimates for 2008-2013 for Charlotte, MI.

Long standing nutritional research indicates that children need an adequate amount of daily nutrients to be able to function cognitively and their ability to think and reason is the foundation for success in school.

In 2013-2014, there were 583 students in the Upper Elementary school and 54% qualified for the Federal Food Assistant Program. The newest statistical data provided by the state of Michigan in May, 2014, indicates the Upper Elementary at-risk students have started to reduce in number from 54% to 51%. This is good news! However the 51 % represents three hundred and five students still at risk of hunger. This Tide Me Over ministry will be targeting 102 of the most vulnerable children.

The weekend food bags, during the school year provides food for each child with two breakfasts, two lunches and three dinners and some quantity of food to be shared with the entire family. The Time Me Over (TMO) ministry will provide individual weekend food bags for these children so they will be ready to learn each Monday.

This is the third year for Time Me Over ministry targeting at-risk Charlotte Public- Upper Elementary Schools' fourth, fifth and sixth graders. ABCUSA has been generous to fund this ministry at the level of \$5,000 each of the first two years.

This year First Baptist Church-Charlotte's Tide Me Over ministry is requesting \$3,500. Even though this ministry cannot be financially independent yet, action has been taken to secure more financial support from local grant opportunities and seek funding from community service organizations. This grant requested funds would be used exclusively to purchase food for the weekly food bags. In 2013-2014, TMO provided a total of 3,133 food bags to children. The cost of each bag is \$5 or \$160 will feed a child for the school year.

The First Baptist Church of Charlotte seeks \$3,500 to support the Tide Me Over ministry for the 2014-2015 school year.
