Dear ABCUSA,

Our small rural church is struggling. Sadly, our children's ministries are more of an outreach, or mission, considering few of the student's families are actively involved in the Delphi Falls United Church. The tiny village is home to many children whose families dwell in both financial and spiritual poverty. We are applying for a Matthew 25 grant in the amount of \$1000.00. If selected to receive a grant, the funds would be used to revive our unique and highly successful Vacation Bible School program. We implemented this program for five years, but with the rising cost of the program, it was discontinued two summers ago. children approach me often, asking when we're going to bring it back.



I'll briefly outline our past VBS experience and hopefully you'll get a feel for how it worked and why it had such a positive impact on the children that attended. Our VBS was set up like a mini church camp. We utilized a cabin site at a local County Park, which was our base for the 3 or 4 day program. The first afternoon and evening was set aside for our youth group, who acted as "junior leaders." We provided training for the kids giving them a sense of unity and purpose. The program included getting a school bus to transport the students to a couple of off-site activities, and although the driver was a volunteer, the cost of the bus jumped from 454 a mile to \$2.00 a mile, the cabin site that had been \$45.00 per night is now \$95.00 each night. Each year, we came up with a Bible story or theme from a specific scripture passage, then tailored all of the activities around that main passage. We include music, art, outdoor activities, and Bible lessons. The camp atmosphere with shared meals and nightly campfires was an experience that many of the kids have never forgotten. Every attendee of our "Fruits of The Spirit" VBS, can still recite the fruit's because of a song we performed at our closing, when all the church members bring a dish-to-pass and we have church in the woods on Sunday morning.

Poverty is a word so overused in recent years, I feel many of us have become numb to the real thing. The effects of broken homes, poor choices made by adults, and a lack of hope for a bright future are robbing many young children of becoming all that God meant for them to be. Doesn't God's Word address every type of poverty known to mankind, offering the same solution for all? The greatest work we can do to address poverty is to be salt and light in a darkening world. By giving children a better understanding of who Christ was, is, and will be, we are equipping them to overcome the poverty that ensnares them. I believe the most important tool a child can be given is a working knowledge of what a relationship with our Savior, Jesus, can do for them. Given that one tool, lives can be lifted from poverty to promise, not temporarily but for eternity. Thank you for considering our request.

Article I

Having been led, as we believe, by the spirit of God to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as our savior, and on profession of our faith, having been baptized in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, we do now most solemnly and joyfully enter into covenant with one another, as one body in Christ.

We engage, therefore, by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to walk together in Christian love, to strive for the advancement of this church in knowledge, holiness, and comfort, to promote its prosperity and spirituality, to sustain its worship, ordinances, discipline, and doctrines, to give it a sacred preeminence over all institutions of human origin; to contribute cheerfully and regularly to the support of the ministry, the expenses of the church, the relief of the poor, and the spread of the gospel to all nations.

We moreover engage, that when we remove from this place, we will, as soon as possible, unite with some other church, where we can carry out the spirit of this covenant and the principles of God's word.
