Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

Matthew 25 Grant--Budget Explanation

The First Baptist Church of Greenville, IL passed an Outreach Budget of 23 events/activities for 2018-19, totaling \$12,450. This represents 7% of our annual budget. Of that budget, seven activities/projects meet the criteria, as outlined in the Matthew 25 Grant, for consideration. Those items are listed below:

- 1. "Get to Know Your Neighbor" \$1,500 5. School Supplies \$500
- 2. Camp Scholarships \$1,500
- 3. Community Seminars \$900
- 4. Clothes Closet \$500

- 6. "Food for Kidz" \$500
- 7. Thanksgiving Dinner \$250
- TOTAL BUDGET \$5,650
- The Church is located three blocks from a low-rent, subsidized housing complex and right in the middle of the Greenville town proper. We invite the town's residents to a dinner: "Get To Know Your Neighbor." We can meet them, communicate, *build relationships*, and let them know who we are. They receive *food*, social contacts, and an avenue for future assistance. Will provide 6-8 dinners for 50 people each.
- We provide scholarships to the ABC/GRR Area IV Summer Camp (Springfield, IL), for any child in need. They will experience *education* and *social connections* with multi-generational Christians. Will provide 11-21 scholarships based on age of the youth and their camp.
- 3. We offer free seminars and workshops to the community to assist with *educational needs, job-seeking skills,* and more. Some topics include life skills, budgeting on limited incomes, résumé writing, interviewing skills, business communication, family issues, gender differences in the workplace, etc. **Will provide up to 6-four week seminars for any member of the community desiring to attend.**
- 4. We provide *free clothing* from our Clothes Closet, to any individual or family in need, in our community. In addition, we purchase personal (new) items such as socks, underwear, bras, and shoes, and provide those, as well. **Will maintain the Closet and allow for purchases of additional personal items, throughout the year.**
- 5. We partner with the community "Simple Room," a not-for-profit group, that provides resources to low income, under-served, multi-ethnic youth in the area. They provide encouragement, tutoring, mentoring, and FBC-Greenville helps by providing a place for after-school tutoring and school supplies. Will allow for purchases of *backpacks and school supplies* throughout the school year, not provided by the Simple Room.
- 6. This is a project that utilizes donations from local churches and civic organizations to purchase and assemble *food* packets for the needy. The required \$50 per person fee, for the cost of the food, allows 10 FBC members to participate and prepare 1600 meals for distribution to those in need.
- 7. A full holiday dinner to provide between **75** and **100** Thanksgiving meals to those in need.

Matthew 25 Grant--Mission Statement Document

The Mission Statement of the First Baptist Church of Greenville is the following:

"Loving God, Loving People, in Service to Others".

This statement has become a commitment of the Pastor, the church leaders, and the 60-80 regular attendees of First Baptist--Greenville. We believe that when we love God, we automatically take on the life of loving His people, as we are all created in His image. We believe that when we love God, He prepares each of us to serve others: those within our church, our neighborhood, our Greenville community, and those within Bond County. In addition, our ministry spills over into the America for Christ, One Great Hour of Sharing, World Mission, and the Retired Ministers and Missionaries offerings. We also meet our quotas for ABWM's White Cross needs, and send those to the appropriate groups twice a year.
