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3. How do you plan to use the requested funds. How will the funds specifically assist individuals battling poverty and its effects?

Motel Meals is a project reaching out to and serving a vulnerable population, families in crisis, living in and near our community, Bordentown, Burlington County, New Jersey. A sizable low-income population is not able to attain permanent housing status. There are a number of local motels in our vicinity that provide short-term housing solutions for these people. The population is transient and ranges from 40 to 70 rooms per month for families, couples and singles. Motel Meals serve approximately 35 families and a minimum of 75 people each month. Anecdotally, we know of 3 teenaged boys and a parent sharing one motel room. The motel rooms come equipped only with limited kitchen facilities and amenities.

Our congregation heads up an endeavor to provide groceries and food for these people. This is a completely volunteer, grass-roots effort. There are no administrative costs for this project. We work with as many as ten local religious organizations (Presbyterian, Jewish, Methodist, Quaker, Unitarian/Universalist, etc.) every month collecting food for distribution. Each month volunteers gather to assemble this supplemental nutritional support for these 35 families. We also distribute a simple hot meal to each individual in these families.
