This ministry is one way to offer support and nurture to the families in our area.

2012 ANNUAL REPORT

BEGINNINGS

Beginnings witnessed a slight enrollment decline in both the Preschool and Parents' Day Out programs during the 2012 year. The Board attributes this to the depressed state of the economy. We increased our fees by \$1/day for the first time since 2009.

In June and July, Beginnings offered the third annual two-days-a-week, six-week summer session. Participating families asked that we offer a summer program again in 2013.

During the 2011-2012 school year, the preschool class had four Karen children attending one day a week, thanks to scholarship donations from First Baptist Church members and Sunday School classes. Beginnings provides these children with excellent preschool opportunities, while also providing the other children in the class with wonderful experiences (mini real-life society.) With guidance from a loving staff, children learn to appreciate people's differences. In addition to these full-time scholarships, Beginnings assisted eight other children with partial scholarships.

Fundraisers (dining out at Chile Verde, Tastefully Simple, and Mike's Car Wash), plus generous monetary and material donations from First Baptist members, have been a huge help to Beginnings' finances. With the support, encouragement and prayers of Beginnings families, staff, board and First Baptist Church, Beginning continues its ministry in the First Baptist neighborhood.

Thank you for providing such a wonderful facility for this needed ministry in this neighborhood. Thank you for your continued prayers and support for Beginnings. I am truly humbled by the commitment of the people here at First Baptist Church to this ministry.

Daily Joy attended Beginnings Preschool two years ago. She is the daughter of non-English speaking parents who are Karen refugees from Burma. There were two other Karen children, all on full scholarship, in the multi-cultured class with her. Daily Joy became a leader and shared her gifts with all her classmates and teachers. After her time at Beginnings, she received the Personal Best Award in her kindergarten class at a nearby public school.

At Beginnings we help children like Daily Joy learn how to share, take turns, work together, negotiate, create, ask questions...in other words, we teach them how to learn! We emphasize God's world as the children go outdoors to explore and learn on as many days as possible. These children get to experience the awe and wonder of creation.

We are aware that these children will grow up and become citizens of our country. They have the potential to become leaders in many ways. It is important that they have a good start on that journey. Unfortunately, due to shrinking budgets, the public school district in our area no longer offers a free alternative to private preschool for these families.

In the past six years, First Baptist Church members have provided between one and four scholarships each year for children of Karen refugee families to attend our preschool one day a week. Many of these children live within walking distance of our church building. We know how valuable a good preschool experience is, especially for at-risk children as they enter the public school system. We have watched these children grow and blossom, and become good students who love school!

First Baptist Church provides us with the building, classroom space, a large gym for use on "bad weather days" and age-appropriate materials. However, the ministry of Beginnings is supported by the families who enroll their children. Because members of the Karen community are often unable to afford preschool, we are applying for this grant. Ten Karen families have requested scholarships for their children for this school year. It is our desire to offer them two days a week of school. The cost of tuition for one year, per student, will be \$2562.

In order to do that, we are submitting this application to you. Until now, our scholarship funds have come from the individuals who have generously supported Beginnings. Sadly, we do not have enough money to reach our goal this year. Any and all funds we receive as part of the Matthew 25 Grant program will be used to provide scholarships so that these children will be well-prepared when they enter the public school system.
