Grace Community Church: "Packs of Food for Kids"

Mission Statement:

To show the love of Jesus Christ by filling the nutrition gap for low-income children in Mauston, WI.

Financial Statement/Budget:

See reverse side.

How the funds will be used:

Grace Community Church currently is working in partnership with the local Head Start program. Our church hosts the program, which runs two four-hour school sessions, four days a week for children who are three and four years old. The program is open only to low-income families. Most of these families are on Federal and State food and rent assistance.

We are looking to accomplish two goals with these funds.

The Head Start program currently provides lunch for all of the children but is limited by the small size of the church's residential refrigerator, which Head Start has to share with the church. We would like to add a commercial-grade 49 cubic foot refrigerator for Head Start to use while the church would use the residential sized one. This would help Head Start provide one nutritious hot meal per student per day.

The other use is a "Packs of Food for Kids" ministry the church would like to start. Our region has done some research and we have found that the children who receive free breakfasts and lunches in the school districts have problems with learning early in the week. Their aptitude and accomplishments improve toward the end of the week. Further investigation showed that for many of these children, they had nothing to eat from Friday lunch until Monday breakfast. Once they got some food in their bellies, their ability to learn improved. Some of our sister churches have started similar "Packs" programs for the elementary schools in their area.

We are looking at partnering with Mauston's two elementary schools as well, as Mauston has a high poverty rate for its size. However, we realized we already had the same situation with the kids who were already in our building, the only difference being they do not get breakfast, either. And while most of their families do get food assistance, Head Start reports that they often run out of funds toward the middle of the month.

So what we want to do is used the Matthew 25 grant funds to purchase a start-up set of backpacks that we can load with nine easy-to-make, kid-friendly meals that the children can take home with them on Thursday. They will bring the empty pack back on Monday and the church will re-load them for the following weekend.

If successful (and based on our sister church's experiences it will be), we hope to perpetrate the program through donations and fundraising. We also hope to look into ways of addressing the lack of breakfasts and dinners served during Monday through Thursday. The new refrigerator would enable us to provide fresh fruits and vegetables in this program as well, as we would be able to store such donations until the kids use them. While we will focus on our Head Start partners, we do hope to work with the elementary schools as well.

We are hoping that we can use Matthew 25 grant money to offset the start-up costs associated with this project. We believe we have the ability to perpetrate the project on our own, but we need seed money. Hunger is a big problem in our community – we want to get started ASAP and with school starting, we do not wish to wait until we have raised enough of it on our own.

We have already equipped the church with the electrical capability to handle the new refrigerator, and we based the meal cost on the Federal per-meal reimbursement program that the school district uses.

We hope the added reliable access to nutritious foods will help young people excel in the classroom.
