Our program currently provides this, up to 3 times per year per child, and we conscientiously shop to try to double and triple how far our donations go!

1. How will the funds assist individuals battling poverty and its effects? What impact do you hope to make on the target group or community?

Nationwide, 1 in 3 families with diaper-age children indicate they cannot provide diapers as needed for their children and in our area, where 47% of children are eligible for subsidized school lunches, we are sure the national statistics apply here. No federal programs provide diapers and diapers cannot be purchased with "food stamp" money. When babies are not changed as often as they should be, they are more likely to get dermatitis, diaper rash and urinary tract infections that require a doctor's visit which forces the parent to miss work. Not being able to provide diapers for their baby stresses parents, which affects the whole family. Multiple studies have shown that children of stressed parents are at greater risk of developing emotional, social and behavioral problems. Early childhood education has proven to be one of the most effective ways to break the cycle of poverty, but without a sufficient supply of diapers, a child cannot attend; this fact frequently forces the parent to miss work and the paycheck that would pay for diapers. Many of our clients seem to be making do until there is an unforeseen problem that pushes them into the "diaper need" category: an unexpected car repair, illness that causes lost wages, taking in a relative's child (many of our visitors are grandparents,) higher utility bills due to weather, etc. The ability to obtain diapers for their children is a great help to these families and is sometimes the only hand-up they need to get back on track.

1.List other funding source(s): Some of our major sources of income from September 2016 - July 2018: Our biggest contribution to date has been a one-time grant of \$5,000 from the Rochester Genesee Region of the American Baptist Churches USA. We have been awarded a \$1,000 grant (to be awarded in June of 2019) from Volunteering Works, associated with the Realtor magazine and its Good Neighbor program. Various groups have written one time checks in response to fund-raising requests: Kiwanis, (\$1000 at start up and \$700 in 2018,) First Heritage Federal Credit Union (\$500,) Corning Federal Credit Union (\$200,) Caton United Methodist Church (\$255,) Corning Mom's Club (\$100 plus diaper drive,) and diaper drives by Curves and Card-Carrying Book and Gift Shop. A variety of individual smaller donations totaling over \$2,000. Our church enthusiastically supports this mission as well, with contributions totaling in excess of \$4,000.

Our BABY BANK Story

Our church has supported the Painted Post Food Pantry (run out of the Painted Post United Church) ever since its beginning both financially and by church members helping staff the pantry and serving as members of the Pantry BOD. As such we became increasingly aware of the large number of families that were in need of help with baby items – in particular diapers. It was made very clear to us by local health officials that when babies and toddlers do not receive proper diaper care, serious and far reaching health issues often are the result. So in late 2016 we laid the groundwork for starting a BABY BANK serving the greater Corning-Painted Post area to help meet this need. The BABY BANK is operated out of our old church library and has its own financial account - totally separate from the regular church accounts. Our church has enthusiastically and generously supported the BABY BANK, and with the support of local organizations and businesses and individuals as well as the enthusiastic support from our church, we have to date managed to raise in excess of \$14,000. However, it has become clear to us that we need to reach out much more for additional support to meet the increased demand for this service.

In 2017, we helped 251 families with 407 children, giving out 20,350 diapers! With each one week supply of diapers (that families can receive three times per year, per child,) we give a container of diaper wipes, a 4 oz bottle of baby shampoo/ body wash, and a 1 oz container of diaper rash ointment. We have an assortment of miscellaneous items available on an as-needed basis, including bottles, formula, bibs, burp cloths, booties and hats, and beautifully crocheted or quilted baby blankets.

Throughout 2017 we saw a steady increase in the number of children served each month. This increase was partly a result of the existence of our BABY BANK becoming better known, but partly also due to an increased need. For the first seven months of 2018, we helped 290 families and 474 children - already well over what we served for all of 2017. So at this rate we anticipate ending 2018 by expending around \$8,000 and having served over twice the number of children we served last year and having distributed around 50,000 diapers. We project that the demand will only continue to grow, especially with a large local employer (Sitel) closing its doors at the end of the year. So our goal for 2019 is to raise \$12,000 to meet the increased demand.
