

ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000 largely based on the degree to which the funds will be used to directly assist persons in poverty. Ministries must be in relationship with American Baptist Churches USA to be eligible to apply, and only one application per church or ministry will be considered per year. Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions.

In conjunction with other faith communities on Aquidneck Island to provide a hot, nutritious meal daily to homeless and working poor individuals and families.

The United Baptist Church John Clarke Memorial is committed to funding our own food and supply cost via donations of money, food and time from our congregation at a cost of \$1000. Each faith group that uses the building also maintains a donation of \$40 per soup kitchen they hold in our facility at a yearly total of \$2600.

We are seeking assistance from the Mathew 25 grant to help offset the cost of the utilities, fire suppression upkeep and new storage for food and paper products at a total of \$3600, so we can continue to serve the needy in our community alongside our neighbor faith communities.

How Funds Requested Will Be Used

The United Baptist Church covenanted with other faith communities in 1983 to provide the poor of our community with a daily hot meal. Our congregation prepares and serves 4-5 meals per year. Because of our proximity to the homeless shelter and access to the downtown community, our church is able to facilitate this ministry by providing kitchen and dining area to a local temple and five churches in this shared endeavor. Soup kitchens are held in our church building approximately 69 times a year.

In applying for the Matthew 25 grant, we are requesting support for the following challenges that we are facing. Although each participating congregation gives a token amount towards the building use, the cost of gas and heating oil are primarily the responsibility of our congregation. We maintain a commercial 10-burner stove and fire suppression system. We provide a freezer and refrigerator. Our tables and chairs take "quite a beating". We employ cleaners weekly. We are experiencing a significant lack of appropriate storage space for paper and shelf products.

Our small congregation has been faithful in donating requested food items to help "defray" some of the expense of the meal. The meal is prepared and served by church members. This has been an ongoing commitment for young and old to participate any way they can in this ministry of service.

The ongoing witness of this ministry in our community is a consistent calendar of meals served in a warm and "welcoming" environment. No identification or show of need is required to come partake in a meal. Individuals and families are treated with respect and full expression of God's love by all participating congregations. Other ministries have developed through this meal such as the distribution of donated hats and mittens, bath products and holiday gifts.

The requested funds will allow us to continue providing a critical resource to the needy individuals in our community.
