The Club will also need school supplies for 35 middle school students.

participate in the after school will be provided the nutrition they need, and draw them into constructive activities that are safe, fun, and filled with opportunities for learning. The impact The Club hopes to make in the community is to help students thrive and want to be educated so the cycle of poverty can be broken. In turn, the parents and families of the students that are served will see the positive effects The Club will have in their child's life. The Club hopes to expose the community to their willingness to reach out to the community they live in and many families will come to visit the church and hopefully start attending church.

## STAR Club, Inc.

### **Mission Statement**

Our Mission is to enhance the learning process through tutoring and mentoring, demonstrating and sharing a spiritual awareness by invigorating both mind and body through stimulating activities. The program will offer a safe, nurturing and spiritual environment, free from stress and pressure.

The STAR Club, Inc. is in the first year of operation and will open the doors to the students on October 15, 2018. The Club is an after-school program for at-risk students from the two middle schools in St. Albans, WV. This after-school program has been made possible by a gracious donation from Patty Shaffer, who was an educator of middle school students in the community for over 30 years and was a dedicated member of First Baptist Church. When she passed in 2014, she left in her will \$104,000 to First Baptist Church of St. Albans, to start an after-school program to meet the many needs of the youth in St. Albans.

In February of 2016, a committee was formed to explore the possibilities of an after-school program. The committee brought with them experiences from their professional careers such as school administrators and educators, social workers, financial and insurance consultants, business owners, and legal professionals. After working tirelessly for two years, The Club will be opening on October 15, 2018.

The Club will need computers and a printer to help the students with their homework and be able to print anything they need for school. The students will enjoy doing their homework more if they have the supplies and what they need to excel in school. Many students automatically give up when they see other students who have the supplies and are doing well in class. Helping improve their self-esteem and their attitude toward school will be an important goal to attain for the students.

The music minister from First Baptist Church will be working with the students about three hours a week teaching basic music. There will also be a concert at the end of the year for the families and church to attend. The Club would like to purchase five learning guitars for the program. The church has five of them and the program needs ten to be effective in teaching the students. The church will allow the students to use what the church has and would like to make sure that all the students who want to participate will be able to do so.

The Club has partnered with many organizations, schools and West Virginia State University. Programs such as Junior Master Gardener and Health and Nutrition from the garden will be programs the students will participate in. These activities will be done in the Spring of 2019 to introduce the art and science of gardening while helping them develop leadership and life skills so they can become good gardeners, good citizens and contribute to their community, school, and family. This curriculum is based on the principle that "Gardening gives people of all ages a place to play, experiment and enjoy the "fruits" of their labors."

West Virginia also ranks the highest in the nation for drug overdoses. This epidemic has been devastating for many states, but WV unfortunately is number one. The Club will open its doors Monday through Friday after school for students to be in a safe place, away from the streets that could ultimately devastate their lives as well. The Club will provide resources and opportunities for recreation, moral education and the development of personal and social skills.

The executive director is a trainer in the nationally accredited Second Step Program, which is a violence prevention curriculum. This curriculum will be implemented once a week during the school year. This curriculum is nationally accredited and has helped many students with anger management and impulse control.

The Club has met with the school's principals and teachers and participated in their open house. Parents were very interested in after-school for middle school, because of the lack of after-school programs for this age. This age is an important time to embrace students because they are developing their identity physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually.
