A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA Office of the General Secretary, to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000. Awards will be granted only to ministries of an American Baptist church in good standing with their Region. This is a change from previous grant cycles. We will no longer award grants to organizations affiliated with churches such as a cooperative group that includes non-ABC churches; applications must be submitted by an ABC church for work being done directly by that church.



Only one application per church will be considered within a 24-month period. Because this change was made following the Fall 2016 cycle, recipients of a Spring 2016 grant are eligible to apply.

Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry.

 Stelton Baptist Church initiates the After School Program, the name of the program will be called King's Kidz Club, due to increasing number of immigrants during the last 5-10 years in Edison, NJ. According to the demographic study of Edison Township, Races in Edison: White (50.2%), Black (9.8%), Latino (8.5%), Asian (37.5%),Other (0.9%) Source: (www.factfinder.census.gov). As new immigrants came from all walks of life, parents struggle

(www.factfinder.census.gov). As new immigrants came from all walks of life, parents struggle to find ends meet while students are trying to fit into the school system and new environment. The funds will be used for operational cost as indicated in the proposed budget. Our goal is to serve 30 students during the school year who attend John Marshall Elementary School and Thomas Jefferson Middle School near the vicinity of the church.

The After School Program will include three components: 1. Education – where tutorial and computer skills will be provided by volunteers recruited from Stelton BC and college intern students at Middlesex County College. 2. Recreation – where students will be guided and learn certain sport technique such as soccer, baseball, chess, arts & crafts, and mural

paintings. 3. Spiritual – where students have opportunity to engage in dialogue of different aspects of faith in view of the diversity in the community, and recognize the mission of Stelton Baptist Church. Funds will be used to serve 30 school students that use for school and art supplies, sport utilities, field trips, snacks, summer vacation bible school materials, and software program focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math).

4. How will the funds assist individuals battling poverty and its effects? What impact do you hope to make on the target group or community? Many immigrant parents are struggling to find job to make ends meet. If and when a job is offered, they work long hours even with under pay, and adding a second job is not unusual if they are fortunate to find one. Due to limited English language skills and unfamiliarity of school system, parents are not able to give proper guidance to their children. Students are seen playing without supervision after school hours or hanging out with friends that easily distracted and become easy prey to fall into the wrong crowd. Stelton Baptist Church locates near the school yard of Thomas Jefferson Middle School and connection has been made with the school principal about the church's initiative of an after school program. Positive response was given not only from the school administration but also from the church leadership especially the young people who volunteer themselves for the mission project.

As the pastoral leader of Stelton Baptist Church and an immigrant myself, I have experienced the hardship and understand various family and economic issues many new families are facing in my community. It's Stelton's mission to "Growing in Christ to fulfill the Great Commission". It is our hope and prayer that through the award of Matthew 25 Grant, we can reach out to not only the immigrant families but children and youth who can excel and waiting to hear the good news of Jesus Christ. By growing in Christ, Stelton Baptist Church is committed to serve God through serving the grass-root community in Edison, NJ.
