Item 3: How do you plan to use requested funds and how will these funds specifically assist individuals battling poverty and its effects?

FCBC is in the middle of the largest immigrant and migrant labor population in California. As a mission driven congregation we have sought ways to bring medical and physical help to those within our community and around the world. Because of some professional networks within our church family we have been able to put together resources from Savemart (a California food chain), Wal-Mart, and California Motor Company in order to provide food, baked goods, along with clothes, health care kits, baby clothes diapers etc. The food items are distributed to the community and other churches four times a month to resource their communities as well. Bigger items are categorized, and distributed once a month. The California Motoring Company is currently providing storage space and vehicle for movement of goods to storage and distribution sites.

4-5. Currently the program is costing \$6700 mainly for gas/mileage and supplies. Obviously we are blessed with emergency items (food and clothes) yet poor in resources to pay for gas and storage space since we will lose use of the garage in January.

Subsequently we would like to use the requested Matthew 25 funds will enable us to continue this ministry which reaches across denominational, cultural and civic lines in order to reach community needs.

As pastor of FCBC of Fresno one of the things I've always been most proud of has been our willingness to reach out globally through our mission dollars and our medical teams. Because of some great networking within our own church we have made the first steps toward an outreach to address some of the emergency needs of others within our community.
