3. How do you plan to use the requested funds? How will the funds specifically assist individuals battling poverty and its effects?

The Southwest Iowa Free Medical Clinic (SWIFMC) is structured under the umbrella of the First Baptist Church Outreach Ministries. The SWIFMC, one of three ministries under said umbrella, is an all volunteer based medical clinic. Dr. Bill Butz will serve as the Medical Director. Pastor Len Taylor will serve as the clinic coordinator. Mr. Darrel Steven Carlyle will serve as the fiscal agent.

A member of the largest network of free medical clinics in the state of Iowa, the SWIFMC is a donor-sponsored, not-for-profit organization/clinic. The creation and construction of said clinic will provide basic health care services through volunteer physicians, nurses and other health professionals at no cost to those individuals/patients, battling poverty and its effects. SWIFMC will house (3) exam rooms, (1) exam/procedure room, vital area, reception/waiting area, nurse/laboratory station, doctor/coordinator/records office and unisex restroom

The 401 East Reed Street location will be rent-free with shared utilities costs with other occupants. Generous individuals, business and organizations provide contributions of cash, supplies, pharmaceuticals and equipment. No-cost membership with Free Clinic of Iowa provides operational and procedural tools, as well as needed equipment, technology and education.

The American Medical Association encourages physicians to provide free services to the poor as part of the AMA Code of Medical Ethics. Charity care is the cornerstone to efforts addressing the healthcare needs of the uninsured.

Red Oak community leaders identified the need and initiated a grass-root effort to serve the underserved through the Southwest Iowa Free Medical Clinic. We believe this is an unmet need in our community, and we desire to champion the efforts to create and staff the clinic.

Physicians, nurses and other healthcare professionals volunteer their time to provide quality medical services. Lay volunteers handle patient check-in, clerical assistance, site maintenance and other tasks to insure an efficient operations.

We anticipate the client base of the SWIFMC to be diverse. Most free medical clinic clients are those individuals who are under the poverty line and in need of said medical services. We expect and anticipate an increase in the demand of our services each and every year to accommodate everyone in need.

The Board of Directors, the physicians, nurses and other healthcare professionals and lay volunteers of the Southwest Iowa Free Medical Clinic are committed to the belief that health care is a basic human right. The Clinic will exists to provide the widest scope of primary care possible to those who do not have access to other health care providers. While care is provided at no cost, it is also provided within the constraints imposed by the use of volunteers and limited resources.

We anticipate the award of this grant, along with another secured funding, the Clinic will serve over one thousand (1,000) clients within the first (12) months of operations.
