BRIDGES OUT OF POVERTY 2014 ABC/USA MATTHEW 25 GRANT REQUEST

West Side Baptist Church Wichita, Kansas 67213

NEED- West Side Baptist Church (WSBC) Wichita, Kansas is a congregation in transition. As traditional parishioners age, a new more ethnically diverse neighborhood population has emerged. In 2013, United Way identified the local community (zip code 67213) as a high poverty stricken area with poor school attendance and extremely significant high school dropout rate. Graduation rates at West High have been as low as 57-percent in recent years. Effects of hunger and homelessness include higher use of public school "Kids Eat Free" services and food bank use. While traditional members at WSBC are more secure in their lifestyle, (often having retired and exited the workforce) new participants brought with them different concerns and needs focused upon ameliorating their poverty. Government decisions to reduce or eliminate safety net services serve to aggravate the impact of poverty. The local, state and national economies are struggling to recover. Business is encouraged to develop jobs for the workforce. Many individuals are not prepared to join the workforce. Inability to obtain employment directly impacts families housing, feeding, education and health. WSBC has identified a top priority. There is a need for a job entry skills computer lab, in our church, to serve our community, as an essential starting point, building a "bridge out of poverty."

CONSEQUENCES – Availability of employment is targeted around an applicant's computer skill (ranging from online job applications to actual computer use for a job). Education and employment offer solutions for social ills. Local initiatives have conspired as barriers for use of computers to apply "on-line.' The municipal decision to not construct a new library and both the remoteness of and lack of workstations, at the neighborhood city hall, also pose barriers.

GOAL – During the first year of funding a process approach was identified that will benefit impoverished residents. To directly impact persons in poverty, this second request for funding targets the following: 1) use of both job and computer skills to obtain larger paychecks; 2) computer use to develop effective resumes; 3) develop computer literacy to apply on-line; and, 4) provide a vehicle for General Education Development certificates or high school diploma. Individuals will use both peer-based instruction and a computer curriculum, (Minnesota Literacy Council), to acquire skills for work, developing an effective resume and completing the job interview process (practicing both online and interview skills). Learning they have the ability to succeed and experiencing skill development will help lift adults and families out of poverty.

OUTCOMES - This second grant request is part of a process of program development. To evidence the success of this project, West Side Baptist Church commits itself to the following goals: 80% user satisfaction, 50 participants, improvement on participant Computer Literacy. Participant's written comments will also be collected.

COMMITMENT-WSBC pledges commitments and in-kind contributions, approximately \$7,500 supporting this application. This initiative is part of a progressive planning process of program development and will be continued upon completion of this funding request. Results will be presented at a conference acknowledging the financial support of the ABCUSA.
