The First Baptist Church of Mt. Vernon, Illinois, is applying for Matthew 25 Grant Funds in the amount of \$5000, however, any amount awarded to us would be greatly appreciated. Receipt of the monies will help us continue our weekly Brown Bag food program to 175 children in the city school system, but will allow us to expand our program to at least one of the poorer schools in the outlying county.

This program, which was started six years ago, has helped redefine who we are as a church body, simplifying our Mission Statement to "Loving God – Serving Others." Prior to that time, we were a 'formerly large' church wondering how long we would be able to stay open. As we searched for something meaningful to do, we kept coming back to the need to feed our children. Our program started small, with the preparation and delivery of 35 food bags per week, however, despite our continuing decline in attendance and advancing ages, the program has continued and grown. With its growth, we have found a way to meet a genuine need in our own community. We don't know whether our church will grow again, however, we do know we will continue to serve the children as long as we are here.

As we are finishing our sixth year of the Brown Bag food program, we are excited and proud of the differences it has made and continues to make in Mt. Vernon. Teachers continue to tell us that our food supplies for the 2-day weekends help meet the basic needs of children-at-risk. They feel it results in a better learning environment for the 175 children we currently serve in grades K - 5. Each bag contains 11 items including some fruit, protein, breakfast items, etc. and costs about \$2 per bag. The church bears the cost of the bags, etc. and uses every cent of donations received to purchase the food items.

A series of articles published in the local newspapers in February caught our attention when Jefferson County was placed on the Heartland Alliance Watchlist, due to persistent rates of high unemployment and poverty. It listed the poverty rate for our county at 27.5%, with 63.8% of the school children qualifying for free or reduced lunches. The Church Council was so moved by these figures, a motion was passed at our February meeting to initiate a new program to provide at least 25 bags per week to Bethel School, during the 2013-2014 school year. Bethel is one of the poorest schools in our county with 1/3 of the children in dire need, according to principal, Craig Kujawa.

God continues to provide the means for this mission even when we are unsure if the funding will be there to continue. During last school year, He used one of our retired teachers to share the concept at two of her sorority meetings which resulted in some involvement by them. God has led two young families to our church within the last year. They are so excited and supportive of this local mission. It is these young families who will spearhead the new program for Bethel School. With ownership of the program, they will become further integrated into our church.

The 2012-2013 school year has cost over \$9,100, with a record 175 bags per week for 26 weekends. This is an amazing accomplishment for a congregation whose average attendance is around 30 per week. Receipt of the grant funds will allow us to expand the program to another school next fall. We can then serve weekly all 45 of the children at Bethel School who are in dire need, not just the 25 we have pledged to help.

Our budget does not include this program as a line item, relying instead on donations. About 1/5 of our budget is being met by drawing from a permanent fund, not knowing whether we will ever be able to replace the borrowed monies. We recognize that there are many more needs than the funds you are disbursing can cover, however, we continue to look for new sources of revenue to help expand our program.
