Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions, rainy day funds, church benevolent funds, regular ongoing church operating expenses (i.e. utilities, insurance), repairs, or for capital improvements or repairs to facilities. Grant awards will be sent to the ABC church that is applying for the grant; checks will not be made payable to an individual or ministry

WARRENSVILLE ROAD COMMUNITY BAPTIST CHURCH BRIDGE TO FREEDOM SCHOOL PROGRAM

For middle class families, summer means fun outdoor activities and a break from school schedules. But for many youth from inner city communities, it also means too much free time. Middle-class options such as camps, summer jobs, and sports are often either too expensive or not readily available in poor neighborhoods. The lack of high-quality, engaging summer programming means youth may not have a safe place to go while their parents are at work. Even those engaged in daytime activities may not be receiving the quality educational or recreational programming necessary to keep them healthy and to avoid the "summer slide". John's Hopkins National Summer Learning Association reports that, on average, youth from lower-income families lose two months of learning, or 22 percent of the school year, during summer break, and those losses are cumulative, meaning that lower-income youth are also less likely to graduate from high school or attend college.

Over the past 4 years an average of 55 families have been served each summer through our Bridge to Freedom School Program. The program provides a safe environment for youth where they experience God's love and are **nurtured spiritually and academically.**

Our Bridge to Freedom School Program is a summer literacy program designed to empower children, igniting in them a passion for learning. As studies have proven, on average, children lose two months of classroom learning every summer. Summer learning loss can affect all students, but studies indicate that literacy intensive efforts such as Bridge to Freedom Schools improve outcomes.

Within our program, the daily 5 literacy structure is used. Scholars spend classroom time writing, reading with a partner, listening and discussing books with their teachers, word work (building vocabulary) and computer time (listening to readings online via Tumble Books.)

Through our collaboration with Youth Opportunities Unlimited, we employ teens and provide a safe place for the summer. They are trained along with other teen volunteers from the Warrensville Road Community Baptist Church to serve as junior leaders responsible for mentoring and providing an enriching experience for our young scholars. Through our collaboration with Indeed We Code organization, our scholars are introduced to coding and information technology career paths.

As part of empowering our children, we refer to them as scholars throughout the program. This brings a level of responsibility as well as a confidence boost to each child. A positive name encourages positive outcomes throughout the program. A person cannot be a scholar without putting effort into it. This also raises the children's' view of themselves. They are seen as someone of high value and each day they prove us right.

The scholars are in classrooms, bible lesson workshops, engaged in fun and educational field trips and community service projects designed to expand their thinking. From quiet reading time to influential members of the community coming to speak, they are learning to love learning.

Our Bridge To Freedom School Program has been a wonderful example of a faith-based organization, and the community working together to "Make a Difference" in the lives of children and families within the greater community.




