ABCUSA Matthew 25 Grant Application

First Baptist Church of Salem, Massachusetts has since 1983 provided the evening meal every other month to *Lifebridge* (formerly The Salem Mission), a social services program that provides food and shelter to the homeless. The church has two teams make up of members and friends of members who gather early in the day on the third Monday, every other month, to prepare and serve a balanced, nutritious meal. The teams try to vary the meal each time. At each meal, 150 to 200 persons are served. The number of attendees depends on the weather. In colder weather, more individuals come to the shelter for the evening meal. And the same is true during the hotter summer months.

In the past, and currently, we allow \$150 meal. This amount *does not cover* what is actually spent for the meal, so members of the team often "kick in" additional monies.

How do you plan to use the requested funds:

The need is great and becoming greater. First Baptist Church would do more if there were more funds available. For example, the teams would: 1) serve 12 times a year instead of only six; 2) additional food would be served to include a salad and milk, 3) more fresh foods would be made available. Often, when there is no other community group to provide the evening meal, our team would be willing to step in and provide another meal beyond the 6 or 12 (with additional funds).

How will the funds specifically assist individuals in battling poverty and its effects?

During the summer, when children are out of school and the free lunch program ceases, the team would provide an evening meal for children during the months of July and August. In addition, FBC has either served or sponsored a Thanksgiving meal to local and international students from the Salem State University who are unable to go home for the holidays. In addition, we would serve a Christmas meal to those same students. The university housing and cafeteria close during the holiday season leaving many students to fend for them.

Poverty leads to hunger. In Salem, Massachusetts it was reported in 2011 that 51% of children K through 12th grade live at or below the poverty level. FBC is located between two elementary schools within three and 5 blocks respectively. The 2012 Status Report on Hunger reported by Project Bread revealed that the food insecurity rate in Massachusetts has grown by over 43% since the start of the recession in 2008. This is the highest rate recorded in the Commonwealth since this data was first collected in 1995. Given this information, the first and most important matter is to provide help in the short term to alleviate hunger – meals served at Lifebridge accomplish that purpose.

In addition to continuing and expanding the evening meal at Lifebridge, First Baptist would partner with the North Shore Community Development Corporation, Salem Public Schools and Project Bread to offer a life skills class in nutrition and how to make healthy meals and snacks on a limited income. Education is a vital component, along with resource development to local families in ending poverty through feeding.
