# 3. How the Somerville Community Baptist Church's (SCBC) Matthew 25 Grant funding would assist those battling poverty and the effects of poverty:

SCBC is a vibrant and diverse congregation of people from many countries and backgrounds who come together to worship God and make use of our differing gifts and talents for the glory of the Lord.

We are a small but rapidly growing congregation of less than 100 that strives to serve our local community by prudently investing the resources available to us. One way we accomplish this is by endeavoring to serve our neighbors as we would like to be served ourselves.

Typified by high costs of housing and living, with a population nearing 79,000 in just four square miles, Somerville, Massachusetts has the distinction of being the most densely populated city in New England.<sup>1</sup> Our church is located next door to *Ciampa Manor*, a 53-unit federally funded senior and young disabled housing development. Further, in addition to the roughly 15% of our city living below the federal poverty threshold, we have many families, college students, and elderly who are either working poor and/or food insecure – that is they struggle to feed themselves adequate nutrition at least part of a typical month.

SCBC would like to use Matthew 25 funding to support our efforts to address hunger and inadequate nutrition in our community by partnering with *Hearty Meals for All*, a Somerville nonprofit spearheaded by a local professional chef and two licensed social workers.

The SCBC - Hearty Meals for All ministry provides a welcoming gathering place where typically 60 to 80 homeless people, seniors, neighbors and guests enjoy a stable environment in which they partake of a nutritious, fresh, and healthy meal prepared by a culinary trained chef and served in fine dining style by members of our congregation and volunteers in the community. In addition to table service, SCBC provides use of our kitchen facilities and dinning space, holds food drives, and provides dinnerware/dinner service supplies for the once monthly community meals.

The monthly expense to the church covering food, additional gas and electric utilities, and materials supplies is currently approximately \$800-900 per month.

If we are blessed with Matthew 25 funding, SCBC will be able to do for the least of these as we would do for our Lord Jesus Christ by feeding the hungry in our midst, offering drink to the thirsty, and taking in the stranger. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of our application.
