

## ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000 largely based on the degree to which the funds will be used to directly assist persons in poverty. Ministries must be in relationship with American Baptist Churches USA to be eligible to apply, and only one application per church or ministry will be considered per year. Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions.

### **How will we use our funds and how will this battle poverty and its effects?**

The requested funds will go towards the sole purpose of providing diapers for the ministry. We get a large amount of food, clothing, household items, etc. donated for this outreach, but the diapers are the main reason for doing this and all the funds will go directly towards their cost.

The funds we raise for diapers specifically assist and provide needs for individuals and families in poverty. Due to the large amount of poverty, teen pregnancy and other negative social issues in our community, the Diaper Depot is providing needs for our neighbors in a way that no one else is. We do our best to assist in a tangible and conservative way and be good stewards of the funds God has provided us. We give out individually packed plastic grocery bags with minimal amount of diapers in each bag depending on the diaper size of the child. This is done to eliminate anyone taking full bags to the store and attempting to exchange them for money. There are no questions asked of families, they are simply asked to sign in with their name and size of diapers needed. We also feel that a conservative amount of diapers can get parents by until the next payday without forcing them to rely on us totally. We are here to EMPOWER not enable! We feel that if the church was doing what God has called us all to do, the government would not have to have their hands in everything. On this note, we will not take government funds or grants, only funds from Christ-Centered or community minded groups or individuals. Diapers are normally only handed out on distribution days at the church (the fourth Saturday of each month from 9-11am) but emergency supplies are available if deemed necessary and we have a referral. We have formed partnerships with many local organizations and agencies to help us find and fulfill the needs for distribution.

Helping keep children clean and healthy is our goal. Jesus said to love the little children and never turn them away and we follow this command. We are also building relationships and openness so that the door may be opened in which we can share the Gospel of Jesus Christ and bring folks into a relationship with Him.

On a side note, this ministry came about as a result of our MCLE training with Glynis LaBarre from the ABC Home Mission Society. It has continued to grow and become part of our community and we truly appreciate ABC/USA for inspiring us to find needs that need to be met and doing it in Jesus' Name. Through the MCLE training, prayer, discussion, initial grant funding, and along with the funding provided over the last couple of years through the Matthew 25 grant, this ministry, which is so simple, is assisting families who may have to choose between diapers for their little ones and putting food on their table. By sharing in this way, needs are being met and poverty and its effects are being dealt with. Praise Jesus!

### **Diaper Depot Mission Statement**

To provide a solution to a commonly overlooked need of both negatively financially impacted parents of young children, and single parents, foster parents, adoptive parents etc. of young children who share the same financial difficulties.

A further purpose is to build relationships with individuals to build trust and openness to the ultimate end of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ.

### **Diaper Depot Budget**

Our budget process is very simple. We budget \$500 monthly for diapers and diapers only. Any other items such as wipes, lotion, powder, clothing, formula, food, etc. is by donation only. No funds are used for any of these items, just diapers. Due to good amounts of donated diapers, an up and down cycle of need and us being more efficient with our distribution, the last few months have averaged approximately \$300 monthly. We do realize this could change at any moment though. We are also planning to go into a low income area of the community to do a one- time offsite "Depot" to reach areas of the community where folks may be on foot and not have vehicles to get to the church on distribution days and that may well be a larger than average distribution. Therefore, we are leaving our budget at \$500 monthly knowing we will not go over that amount but may well stay under it at times.

We have received a grant from a local group, the Snow-Redfern Foundation, in the amount of \$2000 and approximately \$500-700 in other cash donations. These funds along with the requested amount from this grant would put us slightly above our expected expenses and leave us with a few extra funds to be available at the end of this grant cycle.
