

ABCUSA MATTHEW 25 GRANT APPLICATION

A generous donor has given a sum of money through American Baptist Churches USA to be used for programs that address "housing, feeding, education and health with regard to the less fortunate." A panel will select recipients for grants of up to \$5,000 largely based on the degree to which the funds will be used to directly assist persons in poverty. Ministries must be in relationship with American Baptist Churches USA to be eligible to apply, and only one application per church or ministry will be considered per year. Grant funds may not be used to fund staff positions.

The Dominican Republic Team has been serving the poor since 1990. We have grown in size and in ministry over the past 25 years. We have been building a much needed hospital, setting up biosand water filters in homes, rebuilding homes (shacks), building churches and schools, evangelizing, providing instruction and recreation, and in 2010, began delivering food door to door in the poor sugar cane villages or bateyes (FulFilling Smiles). We are now moving into our next phase of FulFilling Smiles, and are setting up sustainable nutrition programs. This past June and July, we constructed a sustainable garden in Batey 50, complete with a solar panel to power a pump to irrigate the crops. We sent photos and a full report of the project to Beth Fogg. During a site visit in January of 2015, we saw that the garden was flourishing with corn, carrots, tomatoes, and cilantro. Pictures of this visit were also sent to Beth Fogg.

We would now like to expand this program to double the size of the garden in order to feed more of the very hungry people in this village. Fulfilling Smiles is blessed with a college student studying engineering who designed and built the sustainable garden last summer and is excited to expand the project with additional funds. The success of this project will spur on further garden projects in other Bateyes equally poor.
